
Dear Honorable Justice Smith,

As stated in my court filings, there are several clear and fundamental errors in the Order drafted by you in the case (No. 1-07-0088). Enclosed please find a copy of two Odometer Forms as trial exhibits (Appendix to Brief 048-049) and Defendant's Supplemental admission (Supplemental Record 295-297).

After a cursory reading of the above documents, one will be readily convinced that it is plain wrong to assume that (1) The State "Odometer Act" can supplant Federal Motor Vehicle Information and Cost Savings Act (VICSA) and Federal Regulation 49 C. F. R. § 580.5(c) ; (2) A car dealer can pretend to be a legitimate transferor first, then, acted as a transferee one months later; (3) A car dealer might sell a car without possessing and showing a title of the vehicle as required by Federal law; (4) A car dealer is allowed to conceal the history of a vehicle's maintenance and ownership record; (5) A vehicle odometer might run backwards; and (6) I have waived all these issues at trial.

Defendant's counsel Ms. Elaine S. Vorberg is very familiar with the above documents. Beyond dispute, the two odometer forms produced by the Defendant are irreconcilable on the face of the text, and fabrication of evidence has occurred in the title transfer process and in court filings. Without question, it is an insult to the intelligence of all legal professionals when Defendant submitted such documents. I believe a lawyer does not have a license to provide deliberate false statements of material facts in court, and the Defendant shall not be allowed to mock at our judicial system by fabricating evidence. And I would be for ever grateful if you can do something about it within your duty and authority.
