Dear Honorable Justice Smith,

As stated in my court filings, there are several clear and fundamental errors in the Order ("Order") you drafted. Enclosed please find (1) pages 2 and 3 of my Brief; (2) page 1 of the Order. After a cursory reading of these, a qualified legal professional can tell: (1) the issues for review you had adopted, as a copy of what the Dealer stated with intention to avoid essential disputes, are evasive, misleading or completely false as compared to what I had specifically and concisely proposed; (2) the Order as well as the Dealer's Brief did not provide any justification for allowing the Defendant to impose its incorrect version of my Issues for Review on the Court, and on the opposing party; and (3) the phrase of "against the manifest weight of evidence" cannot be found at pages 2 and 3 in my Brief. In fact, it is a matter of law that related issues should be reviewed de nov as the case was predetermined without due process.

As the record shows and you know very well, (1) in the Dealer's Brief, lawyer Elaine S. Vorberg pretended she could not recognize her own handwritings; in there, she could not explain why on October 11, 2005 she would falsely contend that the case had been assigned to courtroom 1307 after an argument with Judge Casandra Lewis who presided at courtroom 1304. (2) Vorberg has avoided a simple question ever since, i. e. how, on October 20, 2005, the case was reassigned to courtroom 1307 presided by Judge Davis just as she desired nine days earlier; and (3) in Vorberg's letter, she concocted an expert who had no name, no testimony and no physical existence, simply for the purpose to put her own fraudulent contentions in court filings.
